Ghost Gypsy by Sharon Muiruri Coyne

Ghost Gypsy is a short community film looking at how a young Traveller girl 'Violet' finds her way in world. Ghost Gypsy came about after working with a group of teenagers at St. Aldhelm's Academy Poole. They made me realise how hard it is for young travellers in the twenty first century, who belong to a rich ancient culture, but at times feel unable to talk about it because of fear of prejudice.

One thing that one girl said stood out in my mind that people say; 'You're not a real Gypsy if you don't live in a caravan.' This became the inspiration of the play. Meeting with other members from the Travelling community, I tried to think of a way of honouring their stories and making it relevant for the young girls at St. Aldhelm's. In particular I heard several stories of how land had wrongly been taken way from people and how it was increasingly difficult for them to live as they would like.
